#### MEET THE LIVES YOU'VE TOUCHED:

## Dennifer & Tenasea





Jennifer started doing drugs early, a destructive habit she attributes to "drowning her sorrows" after her dad passed away. Her mom became addicted to pain pills after a surgery, leaving Jennifer to hold everything together. At 16, she crumbled under the pressure. "That's when it all spiraled," she said regretfully. She started using meth at 18 and lost control of everything. A cascade of addiction, loss and pain followed.

The one bright spot in Jennifer's life was her daughter, Tenasea. But once she began losing jobs, her daughter was placed in foster care. Jennifer was living in Tucson and traveling four hours each way to see Tenasea each week. She began using heroin and fentanyl to numb her sadness. "I knew if I lost my daughter forever it would be the end of me."

She asked her case worker where she could go that was different from the other programs she had tried unsuccessfully. The case worker told her about

Phoenix Rescue Mission, and Jennifer watched the video tour online. "I fell to my knees and started crying because I knew this was what I needed," Jennifer remembered through tears.

On July 2, 2021, Jennifer arrived at Phoenix Rescue Mission. "I felt like God carried me here — to get my life back, to get my child back." Jennifer found a community that became like a family, who believed in her when she didn't believe in herself.

And the greatest gift came when she was reunited with her daughter, after being apart for over 15 months. She is now filled with "a huge joy" and sees everything as a part of her faith journey that led her here.

"I can't say how much this place has done for me,"
Jennifer shared with gratitude. "And to the donors

-you have given so many people like me a second
chance and shown us it's possible to change."

### HOPE STARTS WITH LOW.

I Peter 1:3 says, "According to His great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead."

I'm encouraged when I think about the idea of hope as "living" – it multiples, it overflows, it increases and it transforms. When set in motion, it's hard to contain.
